Nel makes paintings, sculptures, drawings collages and films. She also loves colourful materials. So a real Jill of all trades!


Let's see if we can follow in her footsteps.

By clicking on the black spots as you stroll round the exhibition, you will discover the artworks.





2. Wibbly wobbly

During your visit to the exhibition you may have noticed a number of towers.

Crazy, aren't they?

Nel loves collecting things and is always on the lookout for objects of different



shapes and sizes. She finds them in second-hand shops and markets as well as in her own house. She then uses those objects to make towers. This keeps her on her toes because it is difficult to get the towers to stand up straight.



2. Time for a game!

Challenge a member of your household to do this activity with you.

Go through the house looking for all kinds of unbreakable objects: plastic bowls, yoghurt pots, old boxes, etc.

PS: don't tell anyone your secret!






4. Flaunting fabrics

She chooses them carefully, picking out the craziest and most colourful patterns before turning them into artworks.


For this activity we are going to use her favourite shapes.


4. NICE TO KNOW

She took all her fabrics with her and created a large workplace in the middle of the hospital. Nel and the sick children made warm blankets.








Aren't they stunning!
