



### 2. My own family tree




Families come in all shapes and sizes. Two mothers with a child or two fathers with five children. A mother and father with a very small child. Or perhaps a child with several mothers and fathers.













#### Jeanne Milde 🌒



### **3.** *Nel Aerts* •



## 4. Yoga for young and old

### 1. Sunbathing lizard

Mum kneels down and then sits back on her heels with her chest on her lap.

Then you lie backwards on her back. Relax your head, arms and legs.

Now breathe slowly in an out.









### 2. For daredevils

Begin on hands and knees, each facing in a different direction with your feet touching.

Then mum straightens her legs and stretches out her back and arms in an arch shape.

You lift one foot at a time, placing them flat on mum's hips.


### 3. Fierce warriors



Stand side by side, the outside of your feet touching.

Take a big step to the side and bend your outside knee. Extend your arms and hold each other's left and right wrist firmly.

Now reach to the side as far as you can with your other hand.
